## ADMISSIONS GUIDELINES

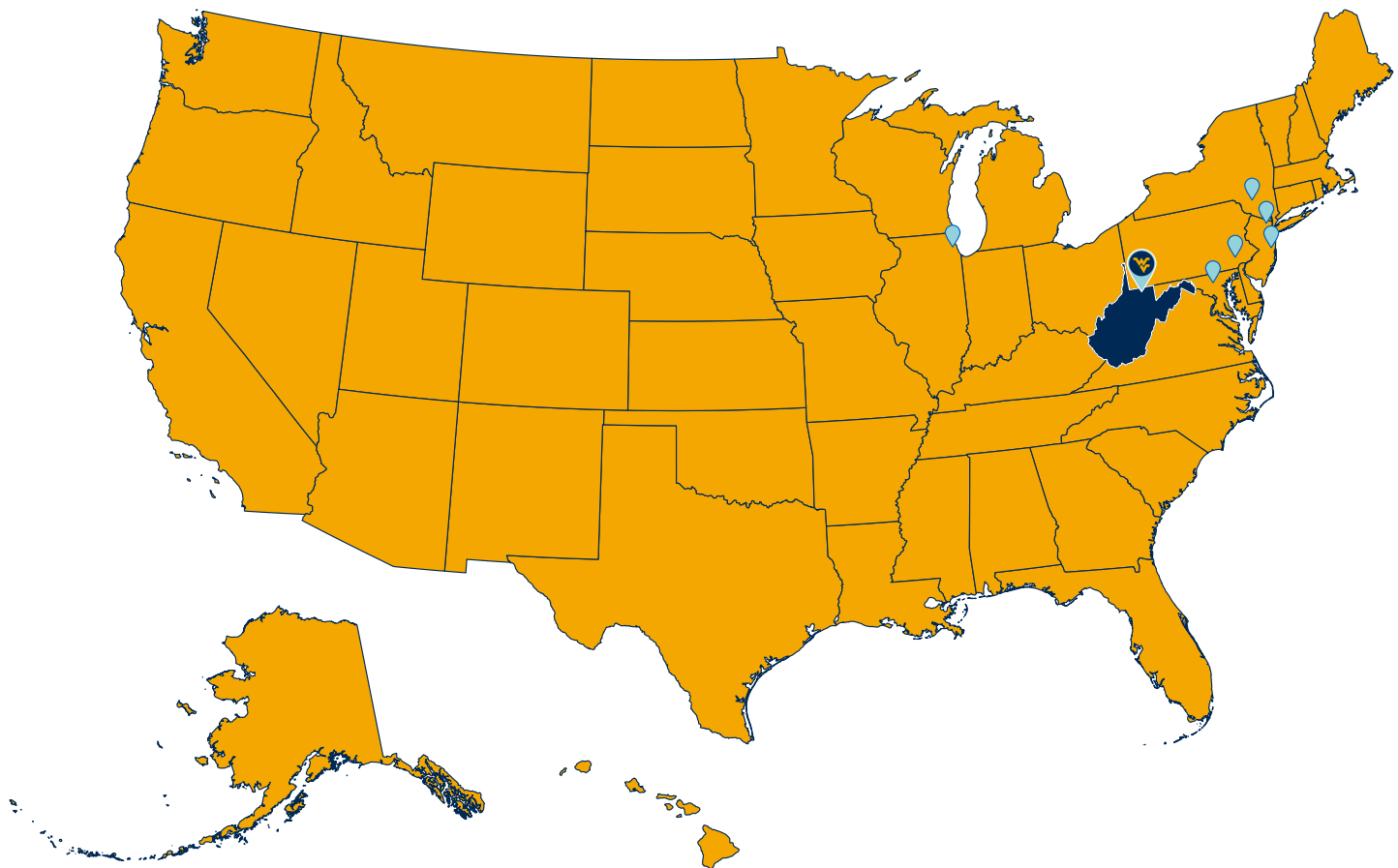
- Baccalaureate or advanced degree from a regionally accredited college or university with a minimum GPA of 2.75
- Resume or CV
- Two to three letters of recommendation
- Personal statement
- TOEFL scores (minimum 550 paper-based) (minimum 213 computer-based) (minimum 80 internet-based)
